Outdoor Learning: Science

Ice boat: For this you will need an ice cube tray, some food colouring, some small straws, paper and some tape.

Fill the ice cube tray with some water and some food colouring. Place the straw inside the tray and leave to freeze. Once frozen stick the paper on the straw so it looks like a sail. When ready pop the ice cube out of the tray.

Then place them in some water, either outside or inside (if too cold) what happens when the ice cube goes in the water? Do the boats float or sink? How long does it take for the boat to melt? What could you do to help make the boat melt? Could you use heat? Will the sun melt it? What about warm water, will that help the boat melt? Can you think of any other ways that you could make a boat? Could you use an apple or any empty containers? Let me know how you get on!

Can you practice getting dressed and undressed with only a little help from your special adult.

You could continue to practice putting your coat and shoes on and off by yourself. Maybe you could try to put on gloves, hats and scarves on your own too.

Fine Motor: On paper can you draw two horizontal lines a little spaced apart. Once you have done this, can you draw several vertical lines going across both horizontal lines. It should look like a train track. How many lines have you drawn altogether? What mode of transport moves across a train track?




Maths:

Carpark challenge

For this you will need some paper, pens and some cars or other toys.

Ask a grown-up to help you draw a carpark like the picture below, they will need to draw 10 parking bays. In each parking space ask your grown-up to help you draw dots for each number 1-10. Once that has been done, ask your grown-up to help you write the numbers 1-10 on separate pieces of paper. You then need to stick these on your cars. Once you have done this, you need to match the car number to the correct parking space. So if you have number 3 car, you need to find the car parking space with 3 dots. Repeat until all cars are parked in the spaces. I think you'll have lots of fun doing this activity.
