What does the painting tell you about him?</li> <li>• Now look at the PPT on our website about Samuel Pepys.</li> <li>• He famously buried wine, parmesan cheese and his papers. Draw pictures of what you would save from the fire. Underneath, explain why you would save these items.</li> </ul>

<b>Science</b>	<p>The following activities will consolidate our learning from last term. Draw your chain in boxes or put your pictures onto paper chains. Can you make a 3/4 or even 5 part chain?!!         </li> <li> <b>Lifecycle of a Butterfly-</b>  <a href="https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zxcmp39">https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zxcmp39</a>            Watch BBC Bitesize 'The lifecycle of an animal' KS1. Draw your lifecycle, setting out your pictures in a circle with arrows (just like we do at school).By each picture, explain what is happening.         </li> <li> <b>Adaptation-</b>  <a href="https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zvhhvcw/articles/zxg7y4j">https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zvhhvcw/articles/zxg7y4j</a>            Watch BBC Bitesize 'Adaptation' KS1.            Choose an animal that you'd like to research. Draw a picture of your animal and explain why that animal lives where it does and how it survives there. ( Think about the environments we looked at: desert, ocean, polar, jungle)         </li> <li> <b>Minibeasts-</b>  <a href="https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zq3ygk7">https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zq3ygk7</a>            Watch BBC Bitesize 'What are different insects like?' and 'Minibeasts'.            Go on a bug hunt in your garden or maybe on a daily walk. Draw or write down the creatures that you see, and how many. Can you sort the creatures into groups? Eg. 'Has wings' or 'Has no legs'.         </li> </ul>
